While hospitals understand the ethical and legal obligations to providing sexual assault patient care, many still struggle to maintain an adequate number of trained staff. Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANE) are the ideal providers for this patient population, but a state-wide shortage continues to limit their availability. Hospitals can seek innovative solutions to providing SANEs through community partnerships and regional response teams.

Deanna Parker is responsible for overseeing operations of Hardin Memorial Health's Emergency Department (ED) that treats 70,000 patients annually. Additionally, Parker manages the Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner (SANE) Program and collaborates with multidisciplinary team members to ensure safe and quality patient care.

Prior to joining Hardin Memorial, Parker directed the nursing medical surgical and intermediate areas for three years at Jewish Hospital in Louisville, and was a clinical nurse manager for University of Louisville for seven years. Parker is a certified critical care registered nurse (CCRN), earned her MHA and MBA from Webster University in Louisville and her BSN from the University of Kentucky.

A registered nurse for 13 years with 7 of the 13 focused on serving victims of interpersonal violence. Prior to relocating to Kentucky, Jackson coordinated a Forensic Nursing program for a large health system in central Ohio. Of her accomplishments while there, she is most proud of developing and implementing a simulation lab to assist in the clinical training portion for new SANEs and a domestic violence forensic exam protocol that was adopted by the three hospital systems within Franklin County. As a part of the Attorney General Training team, she presented around the state of Ohio on topics involving interpersonal violence including: sexual assault, domestic violence and non-fatal strangulation. Jackson holds a specialty certification as a Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner for Adult and Adolescent patients (SANE-A) through the International Association of Forensic Nursing.
