### A Coronavirus First: American Reported Dead

(Newser) At least 700 people have been killed by the <u>coronavirus</u> in China, and the latest victim in Wuhan appears to be a first: a US citizen. Per a rep from the US Embassy in Beijing, a 60-year-old American died Thursday at Jinyintan Hospital, the first known American to succumb to the illness, <u>Reuters</u> reports. Sources tell the <u>New York Times</u> the patient was a woman who had previous health issues.

Per the <u>Washington Post</u>, Japan is also reporting its first fatality: That country's Ministry of Foreign Affairs says a Japanese man in his 60s who lived in Wuhan died officially of "viral pneumonia," per Chinese medical officials. But Japanese broadcaster NHK notes the man had coronavirus-like symptoms and tested positive for it over a week ago, but he died before that result could be confirmed. # Global death toll for new coronavirus exceeds that of SARS, as China reports 89 more deaths

- China reported an additional 89 deaths on Sunday, bringing the total number of deaths in the mainland to 811.
- The global death toll for the new coronavirus currently stands at at least 813, including one death in the Philippines and another in Hong Kong.
  - That number exceeds the global number of deaths from SARS, which killed at least 774 people and infected 8,096 people worldwide in 2002 and 2003, according to data from the World Health Organization.
- The National Health Commission said on its website that 2,656 new cases were confirmed as of end Saturday. This brings the total number to 37,198 in mainland China.
