More than 97,000 children tested positive for COVID-19 in last two weeks of July

(CNN) The report, published by the American Academy of Pediatrics and the Children's Hospital Association, said there was a 40% increase in child cases across the states and cities that were studied in those two weeks. The age range for children differed by state, with some defining children as only those up to age 14 and one state -- Alabama -- pushing the limit to 24.

The compiled data comes during back-to-school season as health officials are trying to understand the effects of the virus on children and the role young people play in its spread. Some schools have begun welcoming crowds back to class and others have had to [readjust their reopening plans in response to infections](#).

At least 86 children [have died since](#) May, according to the new report. Last week, [a 7-year-old boy](#) with no pre-existing conditions became the youngest coronavirus victim in Georgia. In Florida, [two teenagers died](#) earlier this month bringing the state's death toll of minors to seven.

(KHA Daily COVID Update) The Journal of the American Medical Association [released a report](#) on nasopharyngeal age-related differences of COVID-19 in young children, youth and adults with mild to moderate COVID-19. Researchers found that children younger than 5 years with mild to moderate COVID-19 have high amounts of SARS-CoV-2 viral RNA in their nasopharynx compared with older children and adults. The report suggests that young children could be important drivers of COVID-19 in communities. The article highlights the need to watch the child population more closely to see how they impact COVID-19 transmission.

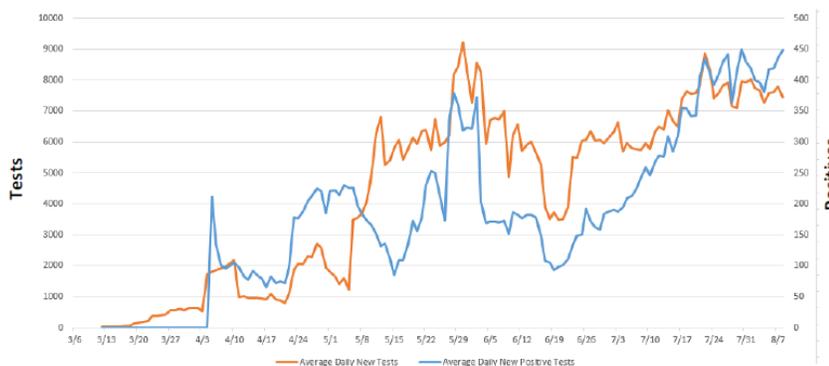

Continuing to use Windows 7 within an enterprise may provide cyber criminals access into computer systems. As time passes, Windows 7 becomes more vulnerable to exploitation due to lack of security updates and new vulnerabilities discovered. Microsoft and other industry professionals strongly recommend upgrading computer systems to an actively supported operating system.
