Government will Increase KY's Vaccine Allocation

(From <u>press release</u>) On Tuesday, Gov. Andy Beshear said he had a call today with the President's COVID-19 team where he learned the <u>federal government will increase each state's supply of COVID-19 vaccines</u> by 17%. "That is a great start," <u>said Gov. Beshear.</u> "The other thing they are doing is guaranteeing a minimum supply for three straight weeks. One of the tough things we've been dealing with is only knowing on a Tuesday what we would have the next week and not knowing what we would have in the weeks after."

The Governor also said two cases of the COVID-19 variant from the United Kingdom (UK) have been confirmed in the commonwealth. "Public health Commissioner Dr. Steven Stack is going to talk about this more tomorrow," the Governor said.

As of 4 PM today, there were 2,714 new cases, and a positivity rate of 9.63%. There were 35 new deaths recorded, for a total of 3,495. 1,566 are currently hospitalized, with 391 in an ICU and 228 on a vent.

Prevalence of SARS-CoV-2 Antibodies in First Responders and Public Safety Personnel, New York City, New York, USA, May–July 2020 (Emerging Infectious Diseases) Of 22,647 participants, 22.5% tested positive for SARS-CoV-2–specific antibodies. Seroprevalence for police and firefighters was similar to overall seroprevalence; seroprevalence was highest in correctional staff (39.2%) and emergency medical technicians (38.3%) and lowest in laboratory technicians (10.1%) and medicolegal death investigators (10.8%).

Allergic Reactions Including Anaphylaxis After Receipt of the First Dose of Moderna COVID-19 Vaccine — United States, December 21, 2020—January 10, 2021 (MMWR) During December 21, 2020—January 10, 2021, monitoring by the Vaccine Adverse Event Reporting System detected 10 cases of anaphylaxis after administration of a reported 4,041,396 first doses of Moderna COVID-19 vaccine (2.5 cases per million doses administered). In nine cases, onset occurred within 15 minutes of vaccination. No anaphylaxis-related deaths were reported.

Why Even Presidential Pressure Might Not Get More Vaccine to Market Faster (KHN) Americans are dying of covid-19 by the thousands, but efforts to ramp up production of potentially lifesaving vaccines are hitting a brick wall. Vaccine makers Moderna and Pfizer-BioNTech are running their factories full tilt and are under enormous pressure to expand production or collaborate with other drug companies to set up additional assembly lines. That pressure is only growing as new viral variants of the virus threaten to launch the country into a deadlier phase of the pandemic.
