KY COVID Update

(KY [Daily Report](#) Summary) There were 263 new cases reported today, with 47 cases 18 and under. The positivity rate is 2.61%. There were three new deaths recorded, with 1 new audit death.

COVID testing's value shrinks as vaccines beat back virus

(AP) Federal health officials' new, more relaxed recommendations on masks have all but eclipsed another major change in guidance from the government: Fully vaccinated Americans can largely skip getting tested for the coronavirus.

The Centers for Disease Control and Prevention said last week that most people who have received the full course of shots and have no COVID-19 symptoms don't need to be screened for the virus, even if exposed to someone infected.

The change represents a new phase in the epidemic after nearly a year in which testing was the primary weapon against the virus. Vaccines are now central to the response and have driven down hospitalizations and deaths dramatically.

Experts say the CDC guidance reflects a new reality in which nearly half of Americans have received at least one shot and close to 40% are fully vaccinated.

COVID-19 lockdowns led to 95K fewer air pollution-related deaths globally

(UPI) Business closures and stay-at-home orders intended to stem the spread of COVID-19 cut deaths caused by air pollution by an estimated 95,000 globally in 2020, an analysis published Friday by [Science Advances](#) found. Lockdown measures imposed on and off in many countries since the start of the pandemic in March 2020 resulted in up to a 50% reduction in concentrations of nitrogen dioxide, a direct emission from vehicles and coal-powered electricity plants, in the air worldwide, the data showed. However, while lockdowns may have led to a more than 30% drop in microscopic particulate matter released into the air as a result of burning fuel, as well as an up to 28% decline in ozone in parts of Asia, their effects in Europe and the United States were negligible. President bolsters extreme weather preparation funding during FEMA visit

(CNN) President Joe Biden on Monday announced his administration would invest \$1 billion in [extreme weather preparation](#) ahead of hurricane season.

"We're going to spare no expense, no effort, to keep Americans safe and respons to crises when they arise, and they certainly will," Biden said during a visit to Federal Emergency Management Agency headquarters.

The President noted last year set a record for the number of named storms, and said the new funding would prepare the US for the upcoming hurricane and fire seasons across the country. FEMA will provide \$1 billion in 2021 -- double the amount last year -- for the Building Resilient Infrastructure and Communities program, and a portion of that will target disadvantaged communities, according to the White House.

The \$1 billion will be directed to communities, states and tribal governments for "pre-disaster mitigation resources to prepare for extreme weather events and other disasters," the White House said in a fact sheet.

The administration will also tap NASA to develop "next generation climate data systems" to track the impact of climate change via its Earth System Observatory.

CDC Publishes First Comprehensive Clinical Care Guidelines for Diagnosing and Treating Botulism

(CDC) Through a multi-year process involving extensive expert input and six systematic reviews of 100 years of scientific literature, the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) has developed and published the [first comprehensive clinical guidelines for botulism](#) in CDC's *Morbidity and Mortality Weekly Report*.

These guidelines provide:

- Recommended best practices for diagnosing, treating, and monitoring people with botulism.
- Special considerations for infants, children, and pregnant or breastfeeding patients.
- Suggestions for supportive care, including psychosocial support for patients and family members.

These guidelines are designed so they may be used when treating one patient or multiple patients. They would be especially beneficial during an outbreak when resources (i.e., ventilators, medical staff, antitoxin) might be in short supply.

Other new resources for treating patients with botulism include [CDC's video on preparing and administering antitoxin](#) and [step-by-step guidance for clinicians of patients with infant botulism](#).
